

- We give you access and guidance so you or an employee can locate the information and use it.






Get the tech help you need (before you need it)

- <u>LinkedIn Learning</u> is free from the library.





















Industry reports – Latest changes and trends

- We have several databases that contain industry reports.
 - Business Insights Essential has industry reports
 - Identify your NAICs codes (hint, these may also be in paperwork you file for your business)
 - Plunkett reports and others
- Accessible from home!
 - Download and read
 - Can be easier to navigate on a computer





Marketing lists

- Reference Solutions/Data Axle has lists of local residents for download in certain geographic areas, incomes and lifestyles.
 - Choose U.S. Consumers/Lifestyles module
 - Navigate in Advanced Search tab, navigating left to right.
 - You can use geography, household income, and lifestyles to narrow and still get names. Consumer snapshop, unfortunately is too identifying, and limits to overviews of general areas.
 - Limit of 250 records/download to combined for use.


